and encouragement.



Impacting Wyoming Families

In February 2023, we reached another milestone in our foundation. Since our beginning in 1996, we have disbursed over \$7 million to Wyoming families whose children suffer from childhood cancer, brain tumors or spinal cord tumors.

In 2022, Jason's Friends expended over \$750,000 to Wyoming families in our program. This was a 65% increase from 2021. This number is a reflection of the overall increase in financial assistance along with the demand for short and long-term lodging in Denver and Salt Lake City.

Jason's Friends Foundation is currently assisting 151 Wyoming families. Each family is eligible to receive financial assistance while their child is in treatment, ill as a result of treatment and for follow-up appointments in the years to come.

We help with travel expenses, including fuel, airline tickets, food and lodging, in addition to vehicle maintenance to ensure each family has a reliable vehicle to get to and from out of state appointments.

We help with household bills back home in Wyoming, including house or rent payments, utilities, phone bills, vehicle insurance and vehicle payments.

Medical bills continue to be another hardship for our families. In 2021, Jason's Friends began reimbursing for the sick child's annual medical insurance deductible.

These numbers represent many stories of the financial stress relief we bring to Wyoming families facing their most difficult battle - having a child with cancer.

Camp Camp Campe Wyoming

Camp Courage Wyoming will be held August 11 - 14, 2023 at Crooked Creek Guest Ranch near Dubois, Wyoming. Ten families will be chosen to attend the 11th annual childhood cancer camp. The camp is funded through grants and private donations, which enable families to attend Camp Courage free of charge.

Camp Courage is a camp for the entire family and includes components for the children with cancer, their parents and siblings. Activities include horseback riding, ATV excursions, art projects, movie nights, a parent social hour, entertainment and much more. It is a fun family weekend filled with recreation and camaraderie.

Wyoming families whose cancer child is 18 or under prior to camp, whether in treatment or post treatment, are eligible and encouraged to apply. Children with a recent diagnosis, as well as long-term survivors, are welcome. Applications are available through the Jason's Friends office or at jasonsfriends.org/camp-courage.

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In Memory of Linda Chivers

I had the huge blessing of volunteering, working with and learning from Linda at Jason's Friends Foundation over the past 16 years.

I was a young, eager to help 22-year-old who was introduced to the foundation by a fellow volunteer. I was roped in and never left. I am glad that I didn't, as so many long-time friendships were made and, of course, I wouldn't have met Linda. I met her when she started as a part-time employee of Jason's Friends in 2006. She quickly showed me how much she cared about these families we were helping and remembered everything about each one of them. She was the perfect fit for Jason's Friends.

She was instrumental in taking the foundation to the next level. She created an accounting system in which her banking background came in quite handy, along with a family filing system. She started a "What's Happening" newsletter to keep the volunteers up to date on the doings of the foundation. These are just a few of the amazing things she did, there are too many more to list.

When I started as an employee in 2015 with Jason's Friends, Linda was the best mentor anyone could have asked for. She was patient but straight forward and worked hard. Linda was left-handed. I always gave her a hard time about those darn backwards checkmarks and the Pilot #7 blue gel pens that were the only pens she would use.

She had beautiful handwriting and always knew the right words to say and write in the moment. Filing was her least favorite task, hence a large pile would collect on her desk. I

think she knew large piles weren't my thing and it would eventually drive me crazy enough that I would make that pile disappear.

She taught me how to be a shining light in these families' lives, to listen to their needs and go above and beyond to help. There was a family returning from Denver from a bone marrow transplant that



had a laundry list of things that needed to be done to their home to make it safe for their son. She orchestrated a group of volunteers to clean and paint the family's home for their arrival. We made a big difference that day. Linda made life-long friends from the bonds she had with these families.

One of the hardest things about being a part of Jason's Friends is when we lose a child. I was so scared to attend a child's funeral but Linda helped me, being right by my side for my very first one. They don't get any easier. She made every effort to be at all of their funerals no matter where they lived. One cold, wintery February she made her brother, Charles, drive us ladies to a child's funeral in Riverton. He was happy to do it.

After Linda retired in 2018, I continued to look to her for guidance. If I had a question, she always had the answer or suggested a solution. She continued to offer her time at the annual fundraiser. Volunteers knew her as the cake lady. Linda loved cake and ensured that every year we



had sheets cakes to share with the hundreds of bowlers who came out to celebrate the event. She also continued to help us in the office. Her requirement to help: NO filing and NO answering phones

(she had hearing aids). She always told you exactly her thoughts, never sugar coating.

These are quotes Linda picked for our memorial acknowledgment letters to families who had lost a loved one and chose to donate to Jason's Friends.


